Memorandum of Understanding
Between
Hong Kong Institute of Construction Managers
And
The Hong Kong Institute of Architects

This **Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU")** is made

BETWEEN

- (1) **The Hong Kong Institute of Construction Managers [HKICM]** at Room 801-2, 8/F, 25 Des Voeux Road Central, Hong Kong.

And

- (2) **The Hong Kong Institute of Architects [HKIA]** at 19/F One Hysan Avenue, Causeway Bay, Hong Kong.

HKICM and HKIA are individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Preamble

This agreement is made between **the Hong Kong Institute of Construction Managers [HKICM]** and **the Hong Kong Institute of Architects [HKIA]** and seeking to build closer collaboration between the two parties in advancing building & construction professionalism in Hong Kong and beyond.

1. Nature of Collaboration

Based on the principles of mutual benefit, both Parties intend to explore the following opportunities:

- 1.1 To promote the professional development of building and construction industry, advocate the policy and resources support from the governments, and nurture a resilient talent pool for the benefits of Hong Kong and the region.
- 1.2 To leverage each of its own networks and organize events to promote building and construction qualification, standards and professional development in Hong Kong.
- 1.3 To encourage respective divisions and committees to work collaboratively for the

exchange of technical and professional information and access to activities to their respective members.

- 1.4 To co-organize and promote events such as CPDs, seminars, technical visits and networking to their respective members.
- 1.5 To explore any other collaboration of mutual interests for promoting the professional development of building and construction in Hong Kong, Mainland and Asia.
- 1.6 Both Parties agree that specific projects and activities derived from this MOU would be subjected to separate discussions and negotiations. Agreements or contracts, if any, shall be signed separately to carry out these projects and activities.

2. Duration of MOU

This MOU will be effective from the date of signature by both parties for a period of 3 years and may be revised and/or renewed upon mutual written consent. Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving the other Party a three months' prior written notice. Such termination shall not affect the validity and continuity of any incompletely discharged obligation agreed upon by the two Parties before the termination.

3. Confidentiality

- 3.1 Both Parties agree to take reasonable and proper steps to maintain confidentiality on the information relating to this collaboration. Both Parties further agree that such confidential information will only be used for the purposes of performing the Parties' obligations under this MOU.
- 3.2 Each Party shall seek the other Party's written consent before making any public announcement on or disclosing any information in relation to this MOU.

4. Advertising and Publicity


Neither Party shall use the name, logo, trademark, or any other designation of the other Party for any purpose whether in relation to any advertisement or other form of publicity without obtaining the prior written consent of the other Party.

5. Miscellaneous

- 5.1 The headings and captions of this MOU are inserted for convenience of reference and do not define, limit or describe the scope or intent of this MOU or any section, paragraph, or provisions.
- 5.2 If there are any other details relating to the collaboration of the Parties which are not specified under this MOU, the Parties agree to further negotiate in good faith and specify any such details in separate written agreements.
- 5.3 Nothing in this MOU, express or implied, is intended to or shall confer upon any person

other than the Parties hereto any right, benefit or remedy of any nature whatsoever under or by reason of this MOU.


