- Maintain close liaison with peer professional organizations, construction trade associations, local authorities and agents and other related organizations by participating in organized events and activities to widen our horizon.
- Serve the community with our professional expertise by encouraging members to participate in voluntary work and foster good relationship with communal organizations.
- Continue in pursuance of statutory professional recognition from the Hong Kong Government and our mainland counterparts.

- Explore more channels to reach out members and actively seek their opinions on various issues, via website chat room, e-news and periodic newsletters etc.

- Continue to explore ways and opportunity in mutual recognition with other professional Institution, and to promulgate the Institute in encouraging more construction professionals to join the Institute.
- Collaborate with education Institutes for having more presentations and career talks to introduce the Institute and construction management profession. Members are encouraged to participate and share their invaluable experience.
